Life on the Borderline

Set at an un-named border crossing, this play incorporates both the writer's own experiences, and some of the many stories told to him by other asylum seekers.

First presented by Az Theatre in 2007, the play gives a powerful depiction of statelessness, bringing the audience in direct contact with the stark reality of seeking asylum.

Readings from the play will be followed by a discussion on asylum, and in particular, the problems faced by women seeking asylum in the UK. Those taking part include Hoshiar, director Jonathan Chadwick, producer Mervat Shallouf – a former female asylum seeker from Palestine, and actors Philip Arditti and Taylan Halici.
